The Southern African Society for Co-operative Education (SASCE) promotes the principles of cooperative education, where classroom learning and practicals are complemented by structured, real-life experiential learning. These are referred to as work-integrated learning (when learning occurs in an industry workplace) or service learning (when the learning occurs in a community setting). The aim of service learning components (a new and important focus area for education institutions) is to promote academic citizenship by sharing the knowledge, skills and resources of the education institution in community partnerships.

The cooperative education model has three important components – the education institution, the company/employer/community and the student. Benefits are gained by all parties.

Employer benefits include:

- a sustainable HR strategy for identifying and developing future employees
- additional assistance at busy times of the year
- access to expertise within education institutions

Student benefits include:

- valuable life and work experience prior to graduating
- consolidating the relationship between theory and practice
- personal growth – in maturity, responsibility, self-awareness and confidence

Academic benefits include:

- developing and maintaining closer industry links
- understanding industry needs so as to better meet them
- opportunity for collaborative and relevant research
